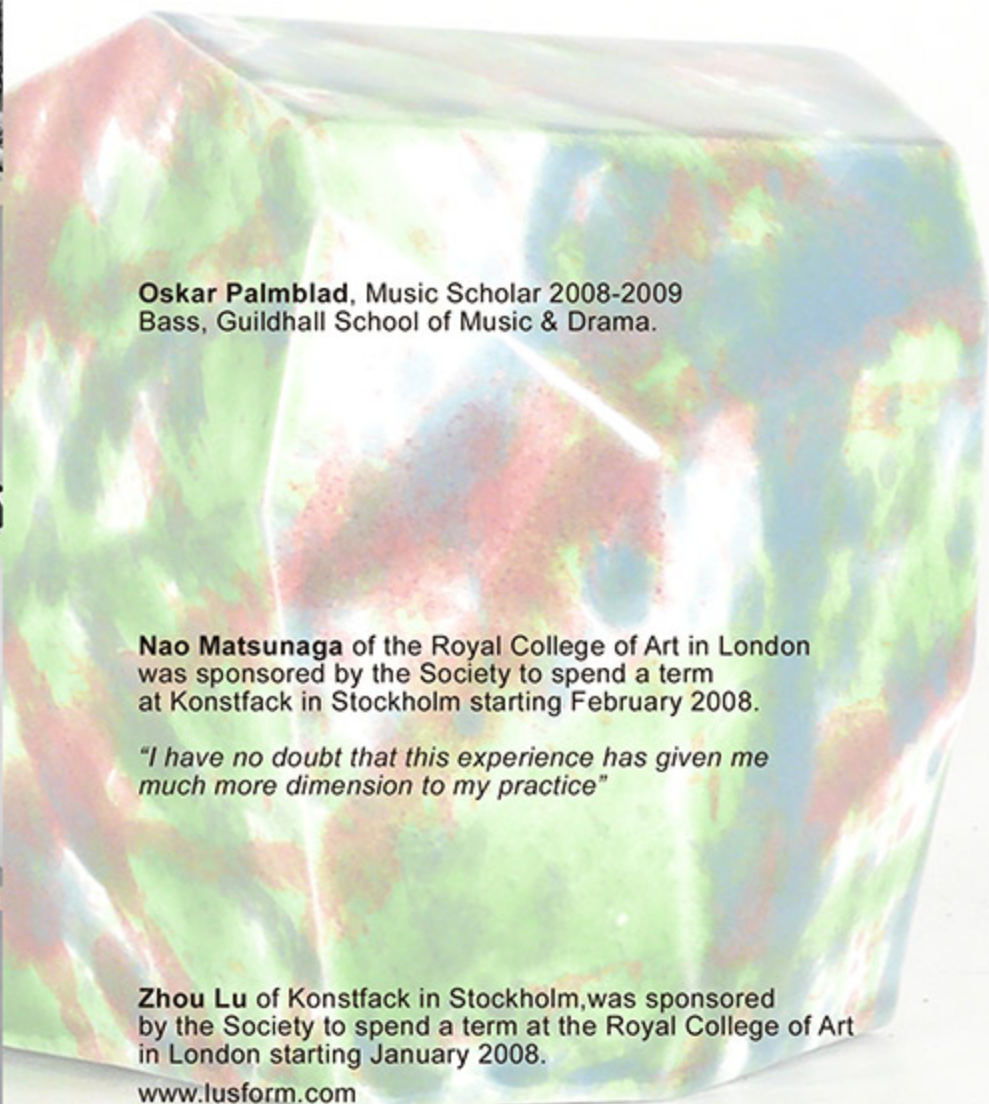

Structure, Governance and Management

Anglo-Swedish Society is a Registered Charity. While the Charity was established in February 1919, it was registered on 21 June 1984 under rules adopted on 16 May 1984.

A Board of Trustees, known as the Council comprising the Officers and up to 12 members, administers the Charity. The Officers are, the President, the Chairman, up to 2 Vice-Chairmen, the Honorary Treasurer and Honorary Secretary or two joint Honorary Secretaries. The President is elected by the Charity's members for 3 years and may be re-elected. The Officers and Council Members are elected by the Charity's members and hold office until the next Annual General Meeting at which they may be re-elected. The Trustees receive no emoluments.

The President, although an Officer of the Society, takes no part in the management of the Society.

The Council has appointed an Executive Committee from its members with the Chairman as its Chairman and a Committee comprising the Officers of the Society and the Chairmen of the Sub-Committees. The following Sub-Committees have been established - Membership, Chairman Mrs Gunilla Nord; Events, Chairman Mrs Lee Persson and Scholarships & Awards, Chairman Dr Christina Goodacre until 22 May 2008; Christine Banér was elected Chairman on that date. These Sub-Committees have power to co-opt additional members.

The Society has the power to make any investment which the Trustees see fit. The Council has considered the most appropriate policy for investing funds and has found that specialised unit trusts, designed for the charity sector, and bank accounts paying high tax free interest, meet their requirements to generate both income and capital growth. The Council consider the income returned on investments in the year to be satisfactory.

Objectives and Activities

"The objects of the Society, which shall have no political character, are:

- (a) the advancement of the education of the public in the science, art, literature, music, history, economics, philosophy, culture and other recognised academic subjects of Great Britain and Sweden; and
- (b) the support of any other charitable activities.

In furtherance of the above-mentioned objects, but not further or otherwise, the Society shall:

- (i) arrange fund raising events and activities.
- (ii) arrange lectures, classes, exhibitions, readings, concerts and broadcasts;
- (iii) print and publish such pamphlets and publications as shall be necessary for the attainment of the objects;
- (iv) administer any funds available for charitable and educational purposes."

Achievements and performance

The Society enjoyed an active year in 2008 and despite the gloomy economic backdrop, continued in good financial health.

Lee Persson's events for members started in January with a supper and the launch of a book by Marina Grut about the history of the Swedish Ballet. In February we saw Henry Wellcome's fascinatingly quirky collection of health-related items and then in March we had a guided tour of the Thames Barrier, which swings into action when high water levels on the Thames threaten London. In April members went on a guided tour of Lord's Cricket Ground which included the famous Long Room and the MCC Museum. We ended the Spring programme with a most interesting visit to the Ismaeli Centre in central London, which caters to the religious, cultural and social needs of the Aga Khan Ismaili Muslim community, which had kindly been arranged with the help of Mr Hasham, one of our members.

The Autumn programme started with a Nautical Evening when Jan-Eric Österlund showed glorious photos and gave a fascinating talk at the Swedish Church on his experiences in circumnavigating the world on his beautiful yacht Adèle. Ambassador Carlsson, the Society's Patron, kindly hosted a reception at his Residence in October at which the Society's Music Scholars, Martin Sturfält and Mae Heydorn entertained members and their guests. The guided tour in November of the superb collection of Dutch Masters at the Mansion House, residence of the Lord Mayor of London, was much oversubscribed but, thankfully, Lee was able to arrange a second visit for members who had missed out. On December 7th Lee arranged a classic 'Julbord' at the Swedish restaurant Deep where members and their guests enjoyed an excellent, traditional lunch of seasonal Swedish delicacies. I know I speak for all members when I thank Lee for yet another year of wonderful events!

The Society continued its fruitful co-operation with the Guildhall School of Music and Drama and supported the mezzo soprano Mae Heydorn and the viola player Ulrika Wielander. As part of the Society's Visual Arts Scholarship Nao Matsunaga, a student at the Royal College of Art (RCA), spent the Spring Term at Konstfackshögskolan in Stockholm which, in turn, sent Zhou Lu to continue her studies at the RCA. We supported the Nottingham Clarion Choir in hosting a choir from Gothenburg and Fredrik af Klint, who took part in a Masterclass of Schubert Lieder at the Britten-Pears Young Artist Programme in Aldeburgh.

I would like to thank Christina Goodacre for her dedication and hard work over many years in first setting up and then developing the Society's charitable activities. I am delighted that she wishes to continue as a member of the Council and to remain on the Scholarships and Awards Sub-Committee although she handed over the chairmanship of this committee to Christine Banér with effect from the Annual General Meeting in May.

This will be my last Report as Chairman of your Society, as I have asked not to be considered for election at the Annual General Meeting in May. I would like to thank all my colleagues on the Council for their generous support over the years and I wish them all well in their continued work for the Society and its members.

Financial review

The Trustees have forecast the level of free reserves (that is those funds not tied up in fixed assets and designated and restricted funds) the Charity will require to sustain its operations and make appropriate adjustments should there be a material reduction in the Charity's income. The Trustees consider that the most appropriate level of free reserves is a sum equivalent to three months of the Charity's running costs £1,448 (2007: £1,475). At 31 December 2008 the Society held unrestricted reserves of £29,539 (£45,375) of which £16,917 (£24,968) is held in investments to provide income leaving free reserves of £12,622 (£20,407).

Statement of the Trustees Responsibilities of the Council

The Trustees are required to prepare accounts for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs and of the surplus or deficit of the Charity for that period. In preparing these accounts the Trustees are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether Applicable Accounting Standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the accounts;
- prepare the accounts on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in business.

The Trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the Charity and which enable them both to ascertain the financial position of the Charity and ensure that the accounts comply with the Charities Act 1993. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities. In particular they are responsible for investing charitable funds wisely to maximise the return in a manner conducive to its charitable needs and demands.

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE TRUSTEES AND COUNCIL OF

ANGLO-SWEDISH SOCIETY

for the year ended 31 December 2008

I report on the accounts of the Charity for the year ended 31st December 2008, which are set out on pages 8 to 16.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and independent examiner

As the Charity's trustees you are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. You consider that the audit requirement of section 43(2) of the Charities Act 1993 (the Act) does not apply and that an independent examination is needed.

It is my responsibility to:

- Examine the accounts (under section 43(3)(a) of the Act).
- Follow the procedures laid down in the General Directions given by the Charity Commissioners (under Section 43(7)(b) of the Act); and
- State whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of Independent Examiner's Report

My examination was carried out in accordance with the General Directions given by the Charity Commissioners. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and the seeking of explanations from you as trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.

Unqualified statement

In connection with my examination, no matter has come to my attention:

- (1) which gives me reasonable cause to believe that, in any material respect, the requirements:
 - to keep accounting records in accordance with section 41 of the Act; and
 - to prepare accounts which accord with the accounting records and to comply with the accounting requirements of the Act have not been met; or
- (2) to which in my opinion, attention should be drawn in order to enable a proper understanding of the accounts to be reached.

1 Accounting Policies

The principal accounting policies are summarised below. The accounting policies have been applied consistently throughout the year and in the preceeding year.

(a) Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention in accordance with applicable accounting standards and the Charities SORP (Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities) issued in March 2005.

(b) Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity.

Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure imposed by the donor or through the terms of an appeal.

(c) Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the Charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

Voluntary income is received by way of grants, donations, subscriptions, sponsorship and gifts and is included in full in the Statement of Financial Activities when received. Grants, where entitlement is not conditional on the delivery of a specific performance by the charity, are recognised when the charity becomes unconditionally entitled to the grant.

Income from investments is included in the Statement of Financial Activities on the accruals basis. Tax recoverable on such income is recognised in the same accounting year.

Incoming resources from charitable activities are accounted for in the period in which the performance takes place.

Donated services and facilities are included at the value to the charity where this can be quantified. The value of services provided by volunteers has not been included in these accounts.

(d) Subscriptions

Subscriptions for individuals are included in the income and expenditure account on the accruals basis.

Corporate subscriptions are included in the accounts on an accruals basis.

(e) Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accrual basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates:

Costs of generating funds comprise the costs associated with attracting voluntary income.

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

Governance costs include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the charity and include the independent examination fees and costs linked to the strategic management of the charity.

All costs are allocated between the expenditure categories of the SoFA on a basis designed to reflect the use of the resource.

(f) Investments

Investments are stated at market value. Gains or losses on revaluation are included in the Statement of Financial Activities.

(g) Fixed assets

Fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of each asset over its expected useful life. Equipment is depreciated on a straight line basis as follows:

8 Membership
