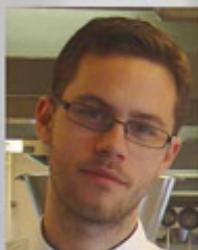

Achievements and performance

The year 2009 was one which brought much change for the Society. Most notably, our tireless events manager, Lee Persson, lost her battle with cancer in July. Active until the very end, she was issuing instructions about the Gala concert at the Guildhall during the last days of her life

Anthony Arfwdsson, chairman of the Council during a great period of revival of the Society starting in 2001, stepped down from the helm at the AGM. In recognition of the many steps forward that had been made during his leadership, which included the establishment of the Scholarships and Awards programme and a much increased level of activity, he was elected vice-president.

Along with Anthony, our honorary treasurer Jan Ankarcrona, the chairman of the membership sub-committee, Gunilla Nord, Annika Hall and Anders Ljung also retired from the Council. In their place, the Council welcomed several younger members: Fredrik Adams, Clara Andersson, Christina Arfwdsson, Christian Bjärnaram, Carl Evander, Christina Sanderson and Alexander Thiel. Alexander Malmaeus, previously vice-chairman of the Council, was elected Chairman.

A series of high profile events to mark the 90th anniversary of the Society were well attended:

In May, our Patron, the Swedish Ambassador Staffan Carlsson hosted an elegant black tie dinner at his Residence. Our musical scholars provided the entertainment. £4,550 was raised for the Scholarship Fund.

In July Sweden assumed the presidency of the European Union. A Gala concert was held in the Guildhall by the Swedish Embassy and the City of London Festival in the presence of HRH Crown Princess Victoria of Sweden. The members of the Anglo-Swedish Society were seated immediately behind the guests of honour.

Roger Gifford is London head of our Corporate Patron of the Arts, SEB. During 2008-09 he was also one of the two Sheriffs of the City of London. He very kindly welcomed us, resplendant in his shrieval chain, to attend a reception and tour of the Old Bailey.

Our Preident, Baroness Madock, helped us carry on our celebrations in grand style with a black tie dinner at the House of Lords. After coffee, she shared her experiences as an appointed Life Peer of Britain's Upper House and told us about the less known but important work which goes on there. The secretary of the British-Swedish All-Party Parliamentary Group, Viscount Craigavon, showed some members around the Palace of Westminster before dinner.

One of our music scholars, Mae Haydorn, sang a leading part in Händel's *Messiah* at the Cadogan Hall in December. We were given red carpet treatment and a special Champagne reception in the intermission.

Members also took part cultural events at the National Film Theatre, Mansion House, Linnean Society and University College London. Instead of attempting to find replacement for Lee Persson as events manager, an events sub-committee was established with Christina Sanderson as chairman.

In September, a branding sub-committee was established in order to freshen up the Society's image. The results were a new logo, branding guidelines and revised web site (www.AngloSwedishSociety.org.uk). The work of Society's scholars was given prominence, and the events section of the site was constructed such that it will remain up to date. The aims of the exercise were clear: member recruitment, member retention and fund-raising.

The inclusion of a history section on the web site highlighted how little information survived once our archives were thrown away by mistake when the Swedish Embassy was renovated some years ago. Research using *The Times* online archive and other sources delivered names and dates previously lost in the mists of time. Of note was the discovery that our Society is, in fact, a year older than previously thought.

The Society continued its co-operation with the Guildhall School of Music and Drama and continued to support the mezzo soprano Mae Heydorn and the bass Oskar Palmblad; the guitarist Oskar Värninge was welcomed as the Society' scholar in September. Katie Alderman from the Royal College of Art spent the spring term at konstfack in Stockholm, with in turn sent Joanna Gunther to the RCA. Moa Höjer continued her Anglo-Saxon, Celtic and Norse studies at Cambridge University. Robert Hägg spent the month of April and Rikard Aldén from Nyköpings Restaurangskola spent the month of November at the Fat Duck in Bray.

Christine Banér took over the role as chairman of the scholarships and awards sub-committee, building on the years of hard work put in by Dr Christina Goodacre, who remained a member of the group.

Carl Evander, who succeeded Jan Ankarcrona as honorary treasurer in May, scrutinised the Society's finances and concluded that our turnover was below the threshold where an external examiner is required by the Charity Commission. This leads to a substantial saving.

Financial review

The Trustees have forecast the level of free reserves (that is those funds not tied up in fixed assets and designated and restricted funds) the Charity will require to sustain its operations and make appropriate adjustments should there be a material reduction in the Charity's income. The Trustees consider that the most appropriate level of free reserves is a sum equivalent to three months of the Charity's running costs £1,317 (2007: £1,448). At 31 December 2009 the Society held unrestricted reserves of £30,442 (£29,539) of which £18,420 (£16,917) is held in investments to provide income leaving free reserves of £12,022 (£12,622). It is the Trustees aim to reduce the running costs of the charity over the next 12 months in an attempt to increase efficiency and create a more stable financial platform for growth. We will continue to fund our ongoing scholarship programs for the course of 2010 with an intention to review the ongoing financial stability of the organisation at the end of 2010.

Statement of the Trustees Responsibilities of the Council

The Trustees are required to prepare accounts for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs and of the surplus or deficit of the Charity for that period. In preparing these accounts the Trustees are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;

- make judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;

- state whether Applicable Accounting Standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the accounts;

- prepare the accounts on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in business.

The Trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the Charity and which enable them both to ascertain the financial position of the Charity and ensure that the accounts comply with the Charities Act 1993. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities. In particular they are responsible for investing charitable funds wisely to maximise the return in a manner conducive to its charitable needs and demands.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and audit committee

1 Accounting policies

The principal accounting policies are summarised below. The accounting policies have been applied consistently throughout the year and in the preceding year.

(a) Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention in accordance with applicable accounting standards and the Charities SORP (Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities) issued in March 2005.

(b) Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity.

Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure imposed by the donor or through the terms of an appeal.

(c) Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the Charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

Voluntary income is received by way of grants, donations, subscriptions, sponsorship and gifts and is included in full in the Statement of Financial Activities when received. Grants, where entitlement is not conditional on the delivery of a specific performance by the charity, are recognised when the charity becomes unconditionally entitled to the grant.

Income from investments is included in the Statement of Financial Activities on the accruals basis. Tax recoverable on such income is recognised in the same accounting year.

Incoming resources from charitable activities are accounted for in the period in which the performance takes place.

Donated services and facilities are included at the value to the charity where this can be quantified. The value of services provided by volunteers has not been included in these accounts.

(d) Subscriptions

Subscriptions for individuals are included in the income and expenditure account on the accruals basis.

Corporate subscriptions are included in the accounts on an accruals basis.

(e) **Resources expended**

Expenditure is recognised on an accrual basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates:

Costs of generating funds comprise the costs associated with attracting voluntary income.

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

Governance costs include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the charity and include any independent examination fees and costs linked to the strategic management of the charity.

All costs are allocated between the expenditure categories of the SoFA on a basis designed to reflect the use of the resource.

(f) **Investments**

Investments are stated at market value. Gains or losses on revaluation are included in the Statement of Financial Activities

(g) **Fixed assets**

Fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of each asset over its expected useful life. Equipment is depreciated on a straight line basis as follows:

8 Membership
